Rules & Responsibility for Open Burning in the City of Clifton:

Burn Permits are required to conduct all open-burning, excluding cooking fires
contained within a barbecue pit, or small recreational fires contained within a pit or
other approved burning container/receptacle. Cannot include banned items.

- Materials approved for burning are wood, brush, tree stumps, branches, leaves, hedge & grass clippings. NO TIRES OR BUILDING MATERIALS.
- The burning of garbage, refuse, trash, rubbish, or like materials giving off foul odors is prohibited (see above). This includes cardboard and plastics.
- All open fires must be <u>at least 20 feet</u> from buildings, fences or other combustible materials.
- No fire shall be set during windy conditions (10 mph or more).
- A garden hose or other water source shall be available at all times during burning.
- Open fires shall be attended at all times by an adult (18 years or older).
- The Fire Chief or his/her designee is authorized to discontinue open burning if it constitutes a hazard. Offensive smoke justifies cause to extinguish a fire and/or revoke a Burn Permit. Watch your smoke and be courteous of your neighbors!
- Applicant shall be liable for all damage to property and expenses incurred which may result from burning done under this permit.
